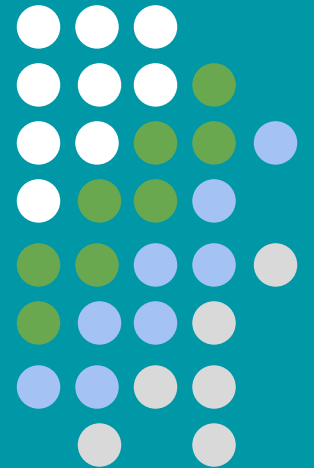

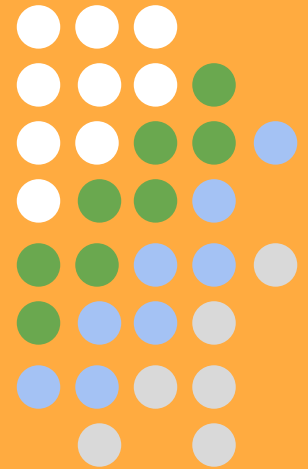

Program Description

Drums play an important role in various aspects of African life, including the physical, emotional and spiritual aspects. Drums are played to communicate, celebrate, mourn and inspire. The African drum workshop is designed to foster a community spirit. In this workshop students will discover the traditional compositions of the Djembe, learn how to play and incorporate some of the African dances that goes along with it. This will bring an understanding and awareness of Africa's cultural heritage.

Program Description

At the end of the workshop, students will also have a chance to show what they have learnt through a short performance.

Participants will also be given an opportunity to perform or play by moving, singing and speaking as masked characters of their own creation.

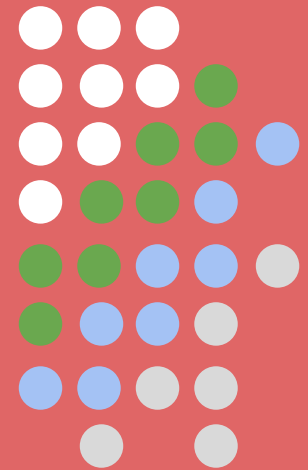

The African cooking workshop helps students develop a better understanding of Africa and the world around them. Collaboratively, students will prepare and serve full meals from a country or a region in Africa. This workshop is typically three hours long, including two hours of cooking and one hour of eating. The Africa Center can accommodate up to 20 students for this workshop.

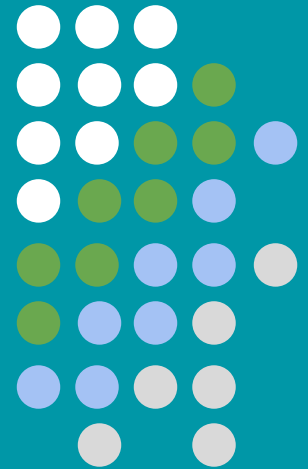

This is a workshop that is based on the design thinking model. In this workshop, students tackle a social problem in a practical manner. Using participant observation and interviews students will be asked to formulate a solution for a problem they are presented with. The problem will be one faced by the Africa Center or the African community at large. In this manner, they will have the chance to learn about the African community whilst also developing their social innovation skills.

Leadership & Global Citizenship Program

Program Description

This is a program for inquisitive students who wish to understand global citizenship and various issues that are affecting the globalized world. Moreover, this program encourages students to think of their role in these global phenomena. The program includes an hour of lectures; an hour of activities that work towards solutions; and an hour of presenting their solutions. This program is designed for highly motivated students and could be done in collaboration with other schools.

Peace & Conflict Resolution Workshop

Program Description

This session includes a presentation, discussion and film screening (optional). The general aim of this program is to find ways to reduce violent conflict and promote justice by means of negotiation and non-violent action. African countries, as a legacy of colonization and imperialism, have faced genocide, war, inter-state conflict, political violence and terrorism. The workshop will help students critically analyze and understand how and why some conflicts end up in destructive forms of social and political violence.
